LINE UP PLACE VALUES

Line up numbers so ones, tens, and hundreds are in matching columns. When a column has 10 or more, regroup 10 ones as 1 ten or 10 tens as 1 hundred. When subtracting, regroup from the place to the left when you do not have enough.

WORKED EXAMPLE

$$346 + 278$$

1. Add the ones: $6 + 8 = 14$. Write 4 ones and regroup 1 ten.
2. Add the tens: $4 + 7 + 1 = 12$. Write 2 tens and regroup 1 hundred.
3. Add the hundreds: $3 + 2 + 1 = 6$. The sum is 624.

Answer: 624
