ESTIMATE WITH FRIENDLY NUMBERS

To estimate a product, round each factor to a place that makes multiplication easy, then multiply. To estimate a quotient, choose a nearby compatible number that divides evenly. Place value can also help you see that 4 hundreds multiplied by 3 tens equals 12 thousands.

WORKED EXAMPLE

Estimate 463×27 . Round 463 to the nearest hundred and 27 to the nearest ten.

1. 463 rounds to 500.

2. 27 rounds to 30.

3. $500 \times 30 = 15,000$.

Answer: 15,000

PART 2 • APPLY IT

1. **About 8,000 tickets** Round 214 to 200 and 38 to 40. Then multiply 200×40 to get 8,000.
2. **About 250 beads per string** Use the compatible number 1,500. Divide 1,500 by 6 to get 250.

CHALLENGE

Leo has the better estimate. 1,968 is close to 2,000, and $2,000 \div 8 = 250$. The exact quotient is 246, so 250 is closer than 200.

Accept equivalent wording for estimated answers, including answers that use the word about. For the estimation items, accept only the results based on the rounding or compatible numbers named in each prompt.
