Write ratios and explain what they show.

MA.6.AR.3.1 "Given a real-world context, write and interpret ratios to show the relative sizes of two quantities using appropriate notation; a to b, or a:b where $b \neq 0$."

KEEP THE ORDER

A ratio compares two quantities in a stated order. You can write a ratio as a to b, a:b, or a/b, as long as the second number is not zero. Read the words carefully so the first quantity stays first.

WORKED EXAMPLE

A school store sold 17 notebooks and 19 folders. Write the ratio of notebooks to folders.

1. The first quantity is notebooks, so write 17 first.
2. The second quantity is folders, so write 19 second.
3. Write the ratio as 17:19.

Answer: 17:19. This means 17 notebooks for every 19 folders.

At a school event, the ratio of students choosing the game room to students choosing the movie room is 4:5. A total of 81 students voted. How many students chose each room? Explain your reasoning.

PART 2 • APPLY IT

- 24:16. There are 24 student interviews for every 16 music clips.** Put interviews first because the question asks for interviews to music clips. Write 24:16 and state the quantities in that same order.
- 27/18. There are 27 coding projects for every 18 design projects.** Put coding projects in the numerator because they are named first. Write 27/18 and interpret the numbers in order.

CHALLENGE

36 students chose the game room, and 45 students chose the movie room. The ratio has $4 + 5 = 9$ equal parts. Since $81/9 = 9$, multiply each part by 9: $4 \times 9 = 36$ and $5 \times 9 = 45$.

Accept a:b, a to b, or a/b when the problem allows that notation. Accept equivalent ratios, such as 3:5 for 24:40, only if the order of the quantities stays correct.
