POPULATION PARAMETER

A parameter is a number that describes an entire population, or full group being studied.

SAMPLE STATISTIC

A statistic is a number that describes a sample, or part of a larger group.

From 45 randomly chosen library DVDs, 18% were overdue.

PART 3 • MAKE YOUR OWN (SAMPLE ANSWERS)

- **PARAMETER:** The percent of all instruments in the band room needing repair is 9%.
- **STATISTIC:** In a random sample of 40 restaurant receipts, the mean tip was \$6.20.

Challenge: The 56% is a statistic because it describes the 200 randomly chosen residents. The population is all residents of Brookdale, and the sample is the 200 residents in the poll.

For the two explanations, students should point to whether the statement describes a full population or only a sample. Accept equivalent language such as whole group, everyone, selected group, or part of the group.
