CHOOSE THE METHOD

A survey asks people questions. An observational study records what people already do, without assigning a treatment. An experiment assigns treatments, so a well-designed experiment can test whether a treatment causes a change.

WORKED EXAMPLE

A researcher randomly assigns 120 cyclists to use either a new bike light or a standard light for two weeks. What method is this?

1. The researcher assigns which light each cyclist uses.
2. Assigning a treatment means this is an experiment.

Answer: Experiment

A club wants to compare three plans: ask students whether they would attend a Friday event, record attendance at current Friday events, and randomly assign members different event reminder messages. PART 2 • APPLY IT

1. **Survey. The council can estimate the percent of students who support more charging stations.** Students answer a question, so the data come from a survey. A random sample can be used to estimate the school population's opinion.
2. **Observational study. No, it can show an association but not prove that more sleep causes higher scores.** The school does not assign sleep time, so this is observational. Other differences between students could affect scores.

CHALLENGE

Survey, observational study, experiment. The experiment can best test cause and effect because it assigns the reminder messages.

Accept "randomized experiment" for experiment and "observational research" for observational study. For causal claims, require that students identify assignment of a treatment as the key feature.
