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HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each prompt aloud, then give students time to mark one shape or draw each matching line. Students show figure identification by finding the named outline even when it appears among other familiar shapes.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY “Look at the shapes in each row. Listen to my question, then circle one shape.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Which shape is a triangle? Circle it.	triangle
b	Which shape is a circle? Circle it.	circle
c	Which shape is a rectangle? Circle it.	rectangle

PART 2 • MATCH SHAPES

SAY “Look at the shape on the left. Can you draw a line to the same shape on the right?”

- **square** matches **square**
- **circle** matches **circle**
- **triangle** matches **triangle**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle-row answers are triangle, circle, and rectangle. For matching, accept lines from square to square, circle to circle, and triangle to triangle.
