Students count groups and compare amounts using less than, equal to, and greater than.

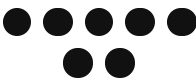
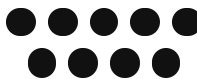
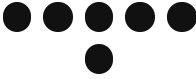
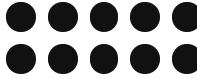

HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each question aloud and give students time to count the dots or think about the number of objects named. Students show each answer by circling a group or number, then matching dot groups with equal amounts.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE ONE

SAY “Look at each row. I will read the question. Count the dots when you see dots, then circle one answer.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Look at the three dot groups. Which group has less than 7 dots?	4 dots
b	Look at the three dot groups. Which group is equal to 6 dots?	6 dots
c	A group has 14 objects. Which number shows a group with greater than 14 objects?	20

PART 2 • MATCH EQUALS

SAY “Count the dots in each box on the left. Draw a line to the dot group on the right that has an equal number of dots.”

- **2 dots** matches **2 dots**
- **5 dots** matches **5 dots**
- **9 dots** matches **9 dots**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle 4 dots, 6 dots, and 20. For matching, connect 2 to 2, 5 to 5, and 9 to 9.
