A FLUENCY PLAN

Read the situation and decide which operation matches the story. Solve in an organized way, then check whether your answer makes sense for the situation.

WORKED EXAMPLE

The school club packs 7 boxes with 8 pencils in each box. How many pencils are packed?

1. Plan: Multiply because each box has the same number of pencils.
2. Solve: $7 * 8 = 56$.
3. Check: Adding 8 pencils seven times also gives 56.

Answer: 56 pencils

PART 2 • APPLY IT

- 42 erasers** Find the total first: $4 \times 15 = 60$. Then subtract the erasers sold: $60 - 18 = 42$.
- 54 students** First find the number of teams: $72 \div 6 = 12$. After 3 teams leave, 9 teams remain, and $9 \times 6 = 54$ students.

CHALLENGE

54 batteries. I checked that 14 kits can be made, and 9 kits remain after 5 are given away. $9 \times 6 = 54$.

Accept correct computations with a matching equation or a clear written check. For the challenge, accept any clear check that confirms 54 batteries.
