HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Tell students that living things need food and water and can grow. You may use a rabbit and a pencil as spoken examples before beginning. Read every word and question aloud, then have students circle one word in each row.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • LIVING THINGS

SAY “Listen to the three words in each row. Which word names a living thing? Circle it.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Here are rock, fish, and shoe. Which word names a living thing? Circle it.	fish
b	Here are tree, ball, and book. Which word names a living thing? Circle it.	tree
c	Here are chair, kite, and bird. Which word names a living thing? Circle it.	bird

PART 2 • NOT LIVING

SAY “Listen to the three words in each row. Which word names a nonliving thing? Circle it.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Here are dog, flower, and spoon. Which word names a nonliving thing? Circle it.	spoon
b	Here are leaf, drum, and cat. Which word names a nonliving thing? Circle it.	drum
c	Here are clock, ant, and grass. Which word names a nonliving thing? Circle it.	clock

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Living Things answers: fish, tree, bird. Not Living answers: spoon, drum, clock. Accept only the circled word that matches each question.
