HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

History tells true stories about people and events from other times and places. Read each story aloud, then have students listen for the clue named in the question and mark the page.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE CLUES

SAY "Listen to each short history story. I will read the words in the row, then you will circle the word that answers the question."

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	A history story says, "Long ago, people built pyramids in Egypt." The words are Egypt, pyramids, people. Which word tells where the story happened?	Egypt
b	A history story says, "Long ago, people in China made paper." The words are China, paper, past. Which word tells when the story happened?	past
c	A history story says, "In 1969, astronauts walked on the Moon." The words are Moon, 1969, walked. Which word tells what happened?	walked

PART 2 • DRAW LINES

SAY "Listen to this true history story: In 1955, Rosa Parks rode a bus in Alabama. Draw a line from each word on the left to the word on the right that tells what it names."

- **1955** matches **time**
- **Alabama** matches **place**
- **Rosa** matches **person**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle Egypt in row 1, past in row 2, and walked in row 3. Match 1955 to time, Alabama to place, and Rosa to person.
