HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each short story and each choice aloud. Students show that money can buy a good, which is something a person gets, or a service, which is work a person pays someone to do. Use a snack as an example of a good and a music lesson as an example of a service before starting.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • GOOD OR SERVICE

SAY “Listen to each story. I will read the three words in the row. Which word tells what the money buys? Circle your answer.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	A child uses money to buy an apple at a store. Is the apple a good, a service, or money?	Good
b	A family pays a person to wash their car. Is washing the car a good, a service, or money?	Service
c	A shopper buys a jacket with money. Is the jacket a service, money, or a good?	Good
