HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Before beginning, display a Florida physical map, political map, and cultural map that include the labels used in Part 1. Read each question aloud, give students time to scan the named map, and have them mark the page.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • FIND PLACES

SAY “Look at the three Florida maps. Listen for the map name and the place names, then circle the name you find.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	On the physical map, which name do you find: Everglades, Tallahassee, or Ybor? Circle that name.	Everglades
b	On the political map, which name do you find: Ybor, Tallahassee, or Everglades? Circle that name.	Tallahassee
c	On the cultural map, which name do you find: Tallahassee, Everglades, or Ybor? Circle that name.	Ybor

PART 2 • MATCH MAPS

SAY “Listen as I read the map words on the left and the focus words on the right. Draw a line from each map word to the word that matches it.”

- **Physical** matches **Land**
- **Political** matches **Borders**
- **Cultural** matches **Traditions**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Part 1 answers are Everglades, Tallahassee, and Ybor. Part 2 matches are Physical to Land, Political to Borders, and Cultural to Traditions.
