Three Regions, Three Cultures

- ① In the Northeast, the Haudenosaunee lived in villages surrounded by wooden walls. Families lived in longhouses made of poles and bark. They grew corn, beans, and squash, and they also hunted and gathered food.
- ② In the dry Southwest, Hopi people built homes from adobe, a sun-dried earth material. Some homes stood together in villages. Hopi farmers grew corn, beans, and squash, using water carefully in their dry land.
- ③ In the rainy Northwest, Chinook people lived near rivers and the Pacific coast. They built plank houses from cedar wood. Salmon was an important food. They traveled in cedar canoes and traded fish, shells, and other goods.

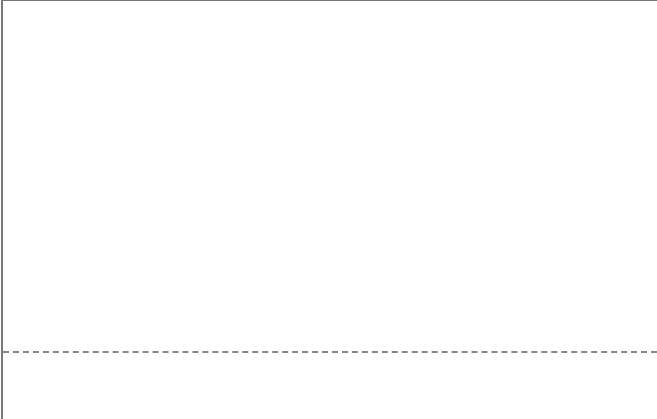
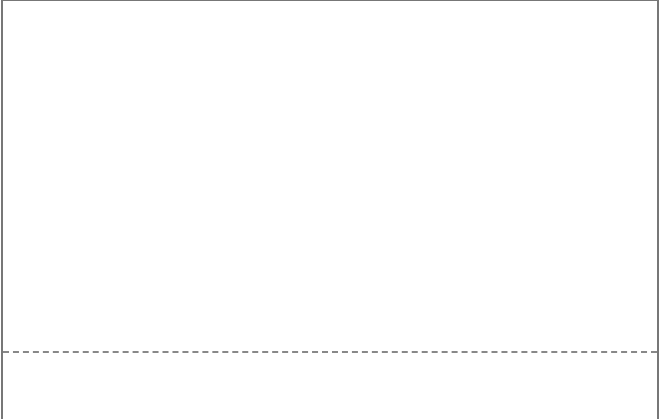
