Many Regions, Many Ways of Living

- ① Long before the United States existed, Native American communities lived in many regions of North America. In the dry desert Southwest, Ancestral Pueblo people farmed where water was available. Some built stone homes in sheltered cliff spaces. Others lived in villages of connected homes called pueblos. Their careful building helped families live in a hot, dry land.
- ② Along the Pacific Northwest coast, the Chinook lived near rivers and the ocean. They caught salmon and used cedar trees for canoes, homes, and useful objects. The rainy coastal climate and nearby water shaped daily life. Chinook communities are an example of coastal tribes whose homes and work were connected to the Pacific Northwest environment.
- ③ On the Great Plains, the Lakota moved often to follow bison herds. This nomadic way of life helped them find food and materials for clothing and shelter. Far to the east, the Haudenosaunee lived in woodland areas east of the Mississippi River. They farmed crops and lived in longhouses, large homes shared by related families.
