HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each word aloud clearly, and have students say the two word parts softly before they mark or write. Students use the vowel sound in each word part to choose or encode the spelling, including open syllables with long vowels and closed syllables with short vowels.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY “I will say a word with two parts. Say the two parts softly, listen as I read each spelling, and choose the spelling that matches the word.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	I said sunset. Listen: sunsit, sunset, sonset. Which spelling matches sunset?	sunset
b	I said robot. Listen: robet, robut, robot. Which spelling matches robot?	robot
c	I said napkin. Listen: napkin, napken, nipkin. Which spelling matches napkin?	napkin

PART 2 • WRITE IT

SAY “Say the parts of paper, then what letters will you write in the first box? Say the parts of rabbit, then what letters will you write in the second box? Say the parts of tulip, then what letters will you write in the last box?”
