HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Tell students that names of people, places, and days begin with a capital letter. Read each choice aloud, then have students mark the word that is written the right way. In the last part, students write each name with a capital first letter.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY “Listen as I read the words in each row. A name, place, or day begins with a capital letter. Circle the word that is written the right way.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	I will read these words: maria, mAria, Maria. Which one is written correctly as a person's name? Circle it.	Maria
b	I will read these words: Monday, monday, MonDay. Which one is written correctly as a day name? Circle it.	Monday
c	I will read these words: texas, Texas, tExas. Which one is written correctly as a place name? Circle it.	Texas

PART 2 • WRITE NAMES

SAY “The small word beside each box is a person's name. Say each name with me. Write each name in its box so it begins with a capital letter.”

- Box 1 (beside noah): **Noah**
- Box 2 (beside mia): **Mia**
- Box 3 (beside omar): **Omar**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle Maria, Monday, and Texas. Accept Noah, Mia, and Omar when the first letter is capitalized and the remaining letters are lowercase, allowing reasonable first-grade handwriting.
