HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each set of words aloud with the meaning and voice that fit it, but do not name the ending mark. Students listen for whether the words tell, ask, or show a strong feeling, then choose or match the correct end mark.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY “Listen to the words in each row. Can you circle the end mark that belongs after the words you hear?”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Listen to the words “Did you find my sock” and circle the end mark that belongs after them.	?
b	Listen to the words “The sun is hot” and circle the end mark that belongs after them.	.
c	Listen to the words “Watch out for the mud” and circle the end mark that belongs after them.	!

PART 2 • MATCH MARKS

SAY “On the left are end marks. On the right are the words ask, tell, and wow. Can you draw a line from each end mark to the word that says when to use it?”

Part 1 answers are question mark, period, and exclamation mark. Part 2 matches are period to tell, question mark to ask, and exclamation mark to wow.
