Challenge: Neither the editors nor the photographer was available because photographer, the nearer subject, is singular. Either the manager or the assistants are attending the briefing because assistants, the nearer subject, is plural.

Accept explanations that correctly identify the main subject and explain its number. For subjects joined by either/or or neither/nor, the verb agrees with the subject closest to it.
