Answers: 1 PARALLEL, 2 MISMATCHED, 3 MISMATCHED, 4 PARALLEL, 5 MISMATCHED, 6 PARALLEL, 7 MISMATCHED, 8 MISMATCHED. Accept proof explanations that accurately identify matching or shifting forms, such as verbs, nouns, infinitives, gerunds, or clauses.
