1	subaquatic: occurring under water	MATCHES	sub- means under, and aqua means water.
2	magnanimous: having a petty spirit	MISMATCHES	magn- means great, and anim means spirit or soul, so the word suggests greatness of spirit.
3	geothermal: produced by heat from Earth's interior	MATCHES	geo means earth, and therm means heat.
4	transcontinental: extending across a continent	MATCHES	trans- means across, and continental refers to a continent.
5	misanthrope: a person who loves humankind	MISMATCHES	mis- or miso means hate, and anthrop means human.
6	bibliophile: a person who loves books	MATCHES	biblio means book, and -phile means lover.
7	exonerate: to place blame on someone	MISMATCHES	ex- means out of or away from, and exonerate means to free from blame.
8	irreversible: unable to be turned back	MATCHES	ir- means not, re- means back, and vers means turn.

- **MATCHES:** interstellar: between stars.
- **MISMATCHES:** The claim that monologue means a conversation between two people.

Challenge: The biographer traced the scientist's life from childhood to retirement. Bio means life, and graph means write, so biographer means a person who writes about another person's life.
