### Cleaner Air, Clear Reasoning

- ① After several smoky days closed outdoor practices, the student activities council considered buying portable air cleaners for the gym. Members began with the Environmental Protection Agency's Air Quality Index, which reports how air pollution may affect health. They also read the gym's ventilation report, which showed that its older system brought in outdoor air but did not filter fine particles as effectively as newer equipment. The texts gave the group a shared starting point rather than a quick opinion.
- ② Next, the council compared three cleaner models using manufacturer specifications and a consumer-testing article. The article explained that a cleaner's clean air delivery rate, or CADR, estimates the volume of filtered air it delivers each minute. Model A had the highest CADR, but its filters cost more each year. Model B had a lower CADR and lower filter costs. The council calculated that two Model A units would cover the gym's size more reliably than three Model B units.
- ③ Before voting, members read a district budget memo and interviewed the head custodian about storage and filter replacement. The memo showed that the current equipment fund could pay for two Model A units without cutting another scheduled repair. In a brief recommendation to the principal, the council named its sources, explained the tradeoff between performance and yearly cost, and proposed a review after one smoke season. The principal could see both the evidence and remaining uncertainty about future filter prices and smoke conditions during the year.

**PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)**

I recommend adding covered bike racks near the east entrance. A student transportation survey found that 48 students bike at least twice a week, and the facilities map identifies an unused paved area beside the entrance. The racks would protect bikes from rain and may encourage riding. They would reduce space for two staff parking spots, so the school should monitor parking use after installation.

Accept accurate paraphrases that connect each source to the council's decision. For the open task, accept varied school decisions when the response names two sources, uses relevant evidence, makes a clear recommendation, and explains a tradeoff.
