Life in Tide Pools

- ① At low tide, rocky pools can hold sea stars, crabs, and small fish. The pools are called tide pools. Ocean water stays in them after the tide moves away, so the animals are still covered by water.
- ② One animal in a tide pool is a sea anemone. It may look like a flower, but it is an animal. Its soft tentacles wave in the water. The tentacles can catch tiny animals for food.
- ③ People should look without touching. A wet rock may be slippery, and tide-pool animals can be harmed by rough hands. When the tide returns, the pools join the ocean again. The animals can move or float away.
