Signs for the Garden

- ① On Saturday, Maya helped make signs for the school garden. She used a thick pencil and clear letters. Each sign had space between words. The sign for peas said, "Peas Need Sun."
- ② First, Maya wrote the tall uppercase P at the start of Peas. Then she formed the smaller lowercase e, a, and s. Her letters sat on the line and did not bump into one another.
- ③ Next, Maya made a sign for carrots. She began Carrots with an uppercase C and wrote the other letters in lowercase. After checking each word, she wrote "Water Carrots" neatly. The class could read every sign.
