A Sign for the Garden

- ① On Monday, I made a sign for our class garden. I wrote, “Beans Need Sun.” I formed each letter carefully. I left small spaces between words, so everyone could read the sign from the path.
- ② First, I wrote tall letters like l and t so they reached the top line. Next, I kept small letters like a and e between the middle and bottom lines. My pencil marks were dark but not messy.
- ③ Last, I checked my sign. I fixed one crooked s in Beans. Then I read each word slowly: Beans, Need, Sun. The neat print helped our classmates know which plants needed light and water.
