A Garden Plan

- ① Teacher Lee tells the class a plan for the garden. First, students listen to her whole sentence. They hold the words in their minds before their pencils begin to move.
- ② Teacher Lee tells the students to water the beans after lunch. The class quietly repeats the words once. Then everyone writes the sentence with a capital letter and a period.
- ③ Next, a student checks the words one more time. The student makes sure no word is missing. Finally, the class reads the written plan aloud and puts the paper near the window.
