Tide Pool Watch

- ① At a rocky shore, a child may spot a small fish in a tide pool. The fish can dash under a shell when a wave splashes. It may hide until the water is still.
- ② Sea stars do not have bones. They use tiny tube feet to push slowly across wet rocks. A sea star can push its stomach out of its body to eat food, such as a mussel.
- ③ People should watch tide pools with care. Do not grab a crab or rush through the water. Instead, look closely and let the animals stay in their homes. A quiet visit helps keep the shore healthy.
