- ① At River Museum, Maya reads a card beside a beaver home. It says a beaver builds a lodge, or a home made of sticks and mud. Maya points to the word lodge and its nearby clue.
- ② Next, Maya sees the word nocturnal on an owl card. The sentence says, "Nocturnal animals are awake at night." Maya checks the museum's animal glossary. It says nocturnal means active during the night.
- ③ At the pond, Maya reads that tadpoles transform, or change, as they grow into frogs. She uses a picture dictionary to check transform. The picture shows a tadpole changing into a frog.
