Garden Day Notice

- ① **WHEN:** On May 10, from 9:00 to 11:00. Meet by the playground gate. Families can help plant beans, pull weeds, and water new flowers. The time and meeting place help everyone arrive ready.
- ② **WHAT TO BRING:** Wear closed-toe shoes and a hat. Bring a water bottle. Garden gloves are helpful, but the school has some to share. This list lets helpers quickly check what they need before they leave home.
- ③ **HOW TO HELP:** 1. Choose a small job from the garden leader. 2. Work carefully with your family or partner. 3. Put tools back in the bin before leaving. The numbered steps show helpers what to do in order, so the work stays safe and neat.
