One Topic, Three Texts

- ① When you want to learn about monarch butterflies, choose a nonfiction article. An article gives facts, such as where monarchs travel and what they eat. It may use headings, labels, photographs, or a diagram to make information clear.
- ② A story about a monarch may follow one butterfly on a long trip. It can tell about dangers, actions, and feelings. The butterfly may even talk, because stories can use imagined details to entertain readers.
- ③ A how-to page can teach a reader to make a butterfly garden. It gives steps in order, such as planting nectar flowers and adding a shallow dish of wet sand. A writer chooses the genre that fits the purpose.
