How to Sprout a Bean

- ① Planting a bean seed lets you watch a plant begin. First, soak a dry bean overnight. Next, place it beside a damp paper towel in a clear cup. The wet towel gives the seed the water it needs.
- ② Then, set the cup near a window, but not in hot sun. Check the towel each day and add water if it feels dry. In a few days, a tiny root may push out of the seed.
- ③ After that, a curved stem grows upward. Soon, small leaves open, and the plant can make food using sunlight. Last, move the young plant into soil so its roots have more room to grow.
