Lettuce from the Garden

- ① At the school garden, children grow crisp lettuce in raised beds. They press tiny seeds into damp soil and cover them lightly. Soon, green sprouts push up toward the sun. The children check the beds each morning.
- ② When lettuce leaves are big enough, the children harvest only a few from each plant. They use clean scissors to snip the outer leaves. The center leaves stay on the plant, so it can keep growing.
- ③ The garden lettuce becomes a class salad for lunch. First, children rinse the leaves under cool water. Next, an adult helps dry them in a salad spinner. The class adds the clean lettuce to bowls.
