Maya Uses Her Tools

- ① Maya loves books about animals. At the library, she chooses a book about sea turtles. Before she reads, she looks at the cover and headings. These text clues help her think about what she may learn.
- ② After reading, Maya writes a page in her notebook. She uses a pencil to jot ideas, then an eraser to fix a word. Her word wall helps her spell tricky animal words. These tools help Maya share her ideas.
- ③ When Maya cannot find a fact, she rereads the page and checks the picture caption. She also asks the librarian for another book. Maya says, "I am a reader and writer who keeps learning."
