Growing Wings

- ① Nia wanted to learn how a caterpillar becomes a butterfly. She chose a book called Growing Wings. Before she began, she set a goal: I will find the steps of the change and tell them in order.
- ② On the first page, Nia read that a caterpillar hatches from an egg. She checked her goal and thought, This is the first step. Then she read about a chrysalis, but the word was confusing.
- ③ Nia reread the sentence and looked at the book's labeled picture. She learned that a chrysalis is a protective case where the caterpillar changes. Now she could explain the next step and kept reading for the last step.
