A Garden Project

- ① At the school garden, Maya saw a sign that said, "Reuse water when you can." She caught rainwater in a bucket. The next day, she used that same water on bean plants instead of getting fresh water.
- ② Later, the class sorted materials for a project. They chose paper, clean jars, string, and soil for the project. Each material had a job: paper made labels, jars held seeds, string tied stems, and soil covered roots.
- ③ One jar had a sticky label. Maya called the label removable. She peeled it off before washing the jar and filling it with paintbrushes. No glue or paper stayed on the jar.

3	What does removable mean? Use what Maya did and the word ending -able to explain.	Removable means able to be removed or taken off. Maya peeled the label off, and -able can mean can be.
