A Goldfish Care Poster

- ① To make a poster about keeping a pet goldfish, I made a plan. First, I would tell what the fish needs. Next, I would explain daily care. Last, I would share one safety rule.
- ② Fish Needs: A goldfish needs clean water, food made for fish, and a tank with room to swim. Daily Care: Feed a small amount once or twice a day. Check that the water looks clean.
- ③ Safety Rule: Wash hands after touching tank water. This helps keep germs from spreading. I did not add my favorite color or a joke because those details would not help readers care for a fish.
