YOUR JOB Underline Mina’s goal, circle Leo’s feedback, and number the three details Mina added. These marks will help you decide if her poster matches its goal.

Mina’s Garden Club Poster

- ① Mina wanted to make a poster for the school garden club. Her goal was to help second graders know when and where to come. She wrote, “Garden Club is fun. We plant seeds and see worms.”
- ② Her partner Leo read the poster. He said, “I like the worm detail, but I do not know the meeting day or place.” Mina read it again. She noticed that the poster did not tell readers what to bring.
- ③ Mina added, “Meet by the big oak on Tuesday at 3:00. Bring a small cup for water.” Now the poster gave the time, place, and a needed item. Mina decided it matched her goal.
