Maya Makes a Poster

- ① Maya wanted families to come to the school book swap. First, she planned her poster. She wrote her purpose, to invite families, and listed details readers needed: Saturday, 10:00, the library, and one book to trade.
- ② Next, Maya drafted a poster with big letters. She read it aloud and noticed that it did not say who could come. Her brother said, "Add everyone." Maya revised her poster to say, "Families and neighbors are welcome!"
- ③ Last, Maya checked each word for capitals, spelling, and end marks. She fixed "saterday" to "Saturday" and added a period. Then she hung the finished poster near the school door, where families could read it.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

Plan: Audience, my neighbors; purpose, invite them to a chalk day. Draft: come draw at Oak Park. Bring your favorite colors. Revision and editing: I added Friday, fixed the capital letter and spelling, and checked end marks. Final invitation: Neighbors, come draw at Oak Park on Friday. Bring your favorite chalk colors.
