A Beaver Pond

- ① Source 1, a park sign, says beavers use their sharp front teeth to cut small trees and branches. They pile wood, mud, and stones across moving water. This dam can slow the water and help make a pond.
- ② Source 2, a nature book, explains that a beaver pond can give frogs, fish, and ducks a place to live. The pond may also hold water during a dry time. Plants can grow near its edge.
- ③ Source 3, a photo caption, shows a beaver lodge in the pond. A lodge is a home made of sticks and mud. Its underwater entrance can help keep the beaver safer from animals that hunt it.

3	Which two sources together show that beavers make a pond that helps other animals? Name the sources and tell one fact from each.	Sources 1 and 2. Source 1 says a dam helps make a pond, and Source 2 says the pond gives frogs, fish, and ducks a place to live.

Source 1 says a dam slows water and helps make a pond. Source 3 says a lodge has an underwater entrance that helps keep a beaver safer from hunters.
