Seeds on the Move

- ① Page 6. Seeds can travel far from the plant that made them. This helps new plants grow where there is space, light, and water. Different seeds use wind, water, or animals to begin their trips.
- ② **WIND TRAVELERS:** Dandelion seeds have **light**, **fluffy** parts that act like tiny parachutes. Wind can lift the seeds and carry them away. Their soft parts help them land gently on the ground.
- ③ **WATER TRAVELERS:** Coconuts can float because their thick husks have air spaces. Ocean currents can carry coconuts to a shore. A coconut may grow into a new tree if it lands in a good place.
