- ① On Monday, Mia planted a bean seed in a clear cup. First, she pressed the seed into damp soil. Then she covered it lightly, and she set the cup by a sunny window.
- ② Each morning, Mia checked the cup. The soil stayed moist, so the seed had water. After several days, a small root pushed down. Next, a green shoot began to rise above the soil.
- ③ Soon, two tiny leaves opened. Mia turned the cup each day because the shoot leaned toward the light. Finally, she moved the young plant to a larger pot, and it had more room to grow.
