Busy Beavers

- ① Beavers are busy animals that build homes in ponds and streams. Their homes are called lodges. A lodge can have sticks, mud, and grass. The water around a lodge helps keep beavers safer from many animals.
- ② Beavers also build dams across moving water. A dam is a wall of sticks, stones, and mud. It slows the water and can make a pond. The pond gives beavers a deep place to swim and find food.
- ③ Beavers have body parts that help them work in water. Their wide, flat tails help them steer as they swim. Webbed back feet push water behind them. Thick fur helps keep their bodies warm in cold water.
