Why Shadows Change

- ① On a sunny day, Maya noticed her shadow on the sidewalk. A shadow forms when an object blocks light. The sun's light travels in straight lines, but Maya's body stops some of the light from reaching the ground.
- ② Because light cannot reach that spot, the ground looks darker there. As Maya walks, her body blocks light in a new place. Her shadow moves with her because it is made by the light her body blocks.
- ③ Later, Maya stood near a tall tree. The tree blocked sunlight too, making a large shadow. When clouds covered the sun, less direct sunlight reached the ground, so Maya's shadow and the tree's shadow looked faint.

#	QUESTION	ANSWER
1	What happens after Maya's body blocks the sun's light? Explain the connection.	The ground where the light cannot reach looks darker, so Maya has a shadow.
2	Why does Maya's shadow move when she walks?	Her body blocks light in a new place as she walks, so her shadow moves with her.
3	How do clouds covering the sun change the shadows?	Clouds let less direct sunlight reach the ground, so the shadows look faint.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

The tall tree blocks sunlight, so it makes a large shadow. When clouds cover the sun, less direct sunlight reaches the ground, so the tree's shadow looks faint.

Accept answers that connect a cause to an effect using details from the passage. For Part 3, both sentences should accurately explain the tree blocking sunlight and clouds making its shadow faint.
