Bridges Side by Side

- ① Bridges help people cross rivers, roads, and valleys. Some bridges are made of wood. Others are made of stone, steel, or concrete. Builders choose materials based on where the bridge will stand and how much weight it must hold.
- ② A beam bridge is like a long, flat path held up by supports. It works well over short spaces. A suspension bridge has tall towers and strong cables. Its cables hold the road over longer spaces.
- ③ Both kinds of bridges carry people and cars. However, they do not look or work the same. Comparing them helps readers see why a beam bridge may fit one place, while a suspension bridge may fit another.
