- ② Plop, plop, a pebble falls near my toe. Plop, plop, small rings grow wide. Plop, plop,  
the water wiggles in the sun. Plop, plop, tiny waves go to the shore.
- ③ Crickets chirp under dark leaves by the shore. The round moon makes a silver path on  
water. I whisper, "Good night, pond," before I walk home. The pond whispers, "Good  
night, too," in my mind.
