Bats at the Pond

- ① Just after sunset, Nia stood quietly beside a pond. A small bat swooped through the air above her. “Where is it going?” she said. Her uncle pointed to a dark space under the bridge. He told Nia that bats may sleep there during the day. At night, they search for insects, using sounds that people cannot hear.
- ② Bats do not use their eyes alone. Many kinds send out tiny calls, then listen for echoes. The echoes help them know where a moth or beetle is flying. Nia could not hear the calls, because they were too high for human ears. She watched the bat turn quickly, then glide toward a bug near the water.
- ③ Before leaving, Nia asked why bats mattered. Her uncle said they eat many insects, including some that nibble crops. He also explained that not every bat eats bugs. Some bats drink nectar or eat fruit, and they can help plants make seeds. Nia smiled as the bat disappeared into the night. She hoped to see one again.
