Maya at Pine Ridge

- ① At sunrise, Maya climbed the wooden steps of the Pine Ridge fire lookout. From the small cabin, she could see miles of forest, rocky slopes, and a silver lake. Her job was to watch for smoke during the dry summer. A radio, binoculars, map, and water bottle rested on a shelf beside the window inside the cabin.
- ② At 10:15, Maya noticed a thin gray line above the western trees. She lifted her binoculars and checked the location on her map. The line came from a campfire near a trail, not a wildfire. Maya spoke clearly into the radio, giving the trail name and the direction of the smoke. A ranger soon contacted the campers by radio.
- ③ Later, clouds covered the sun, and a cool wind moved through the pines. Maya wrote each observation in a logbook, including the time, weather, and place. Careful notes help firefighters decide where to look first if a fire begins. When Maya's shift ended, another lookout arrived and read the logbook before watching the quiet forest.
