Busy Beavers

- ① Beavers are large rodents that live near ponds, streams, and rivers. Their wide, flat tails help them swim and balance on land. A beaver may carry branches to the bank, the land beside the water. It uses strong front teeth to cut small trees. The branches can become part of a dam, a wall that slows moving water.
- ② After a dam slows a stream, water can spread into a pond. This deeper water may protect the beaver's home from some animals. The home is called a lodge. A lodge has an underwater entrance, so a beaver can swim inside. In winter, the pond may freeze on top, but the water below the ice stays liquid.
- ③ Beavers do not build every dam in the same way. They choose places where the current, or flowing water, can be slowed. Mud and stones may fill spaces between branches. When a dam holds back water, the pond behind it can grow larger. People sometimes see a beaver at dusk, when it is busy carrying food or building materials.
