A Barn Owl Visit

- ① After school, Tia went to a nature center near a green meadow. A guide showed her a barn owl resting in a wooden box. The owl had round eyes and soft brown feathers. It could turn its head far around, but it did not move from its perch. Tia looked closely and drew the owl in her notebook.
- ② At the center, Tia learned that barn owls hunt mostly at night. Their sharp hearing helps them find a mouse under leaves or snow. A barn owl can fly low and quiet because the edges of its wing feathers soften the sound. When it catches food, it may swallow it whole. Later, it rests in a safe place.
- ③ Before leaving, Tia saw a sign about helping wildlife. The sign said to keep dogs on a leash and to leave young animals where they are found. A baby owl may seem alone, yet its parent could be nearby. Tia chose to watch from far away. She knew a quiet, safe space gives animals room to grow.

2	What sound does ow make in brown? What sound does ow make in snow?	In brown, ow says /ou/. In snow, ow says /ō/.
3	Find one oo word with the vowel sound in moon and one oo word with the vowel sound in book.	Answers vary. Example: school has the sound in moon; wooden has the sound in book.
4	For each word, write the letter group and its sound: head, green, owl, grow, room, looked.	head: ea, /ē/; green: ea, /ē/; owl: ow, /ou/; grow: ow, /ō/; room: oo, /ū/; looked: oo, /ū/ as in book.
