6	Dad, where is my red hat?	CORRECT	A comma correctly follows Dad, the person being spoken to.
7	No I did not spill the juice.	FIX	A comma is needed after no.
8	Nora bring the map, please.	FIX	A comma is needed after Nora, the person being spoken to.
