Life Between the Tides

- ① At low tide, the ocean pulls back and leaves rocky pools along the shore. These tide pools are small habitats, or homes, for living things. Sea stars cling to wet rocks, while tiny crabs hide under seaweed. A visitor must step carefully because the pools contain slippery stones and delicate animals that can be harmed easily.
- ② A scientist may observe a tide pool without picking up its animals. To observe means to look closely and notice details. The scientist can record, or write down, how many limpets are on a rock. Limpets are small sea animals with cone-shaped shells. This record helps the scientist compare what lives in different pools at different times of day.
- ③ Weather also changes a tide pool. During a hot afternoon, some pool water can evaporate, or change from liquid water into water vapor. As the water level drops, the remaining water becomes saltier. Animals may move into shaded cracks to stay cool. These changes show why a tide pool is an ecosystem, a place where living and nonliving parts affect one another.
